FIREARMS courses for non-peace officers require a CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE, CRIMINAL HISTORY CLEARANCE LETTER. Refer to course flyers or contact SRPSTC personnel for additional information.

## Course Descriptions

### LAW ENFORCEMENT

#### PC 832, Arrest, Search & Seizure

This course satisfies the requirement for peace officers identified in sections 830.10 and 830.11 of the California Penal Code. Subjects include orientation, ethics, discretionary decision-making, arrest, search, seizure and communications. This course in combination with the Firearms Familiarization Course meets the requirement for Reserve Officer – Level III (Part 1) training.

In order to meet POST's minimum arrest technique's requirements, this course requires stressful physical activities that require full use of arms and legs. Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.

This certified PC 832 course, which is designed specifically for peace officers, **does not** qualify students for certification as registered guards and/or armed registered guards with the Department of Consumer Affairs. **Attendance is mandatory. No late arrivals or absences are permitted. Certificate expires in three years if not hired as a peace officer.**

Prerequisite: At least 18 years of age.

#### PC 832 Firearms Familiarization

This course covers the legal, moral and safety aspects of firearms use, range firing and qualification, weapon care and cleaning. This course complies with the requirements of section 832 of the Penal Code. **Attendance is mandatory. No late arrivals or absences are permitted.** This course **does not** qualify students for certification as armed registered guards with the Department of Consumer Affairs. **Certificate expires in three years if not hired as a peace officer.**

Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.

Prerequisite: PC 832, Arrest, Search & Seizure and **current California Department of Justice, Criminal History Clearance Letter.**

## **Adult Corrections Officer Core Course**

The Adult Corrections Officer Core Course is a 179-hour intensive course taught over 4 ½ weeks. Topics include adult criminal justice system, roles and responsibilities, classification and housing, visitation procedures, court testimony, intake and release procedures, and inmate psychological problems. This course also involves physical training and self defensive and restraint procedures that include ground fighting techniques.

Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.

Advisory: Individuals attending this course should review STC physical requirements for this course.

Prerequisite: High School Diploma or GED

## **Background Investigation**

This course is designed for personnel who conduct background investigations for the hiring of law enforcement personnel. Topics include roles and responsibilities, job dimensions, areas of inquiry, legal aspects, devices for detecting deception, information sources, interviewing techniques, and psychological evaluations.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST, STC, Basic Academy

*Cert: POST & STC (Plan IV)*

*32 Hours*

*2 Units*

## **Background Investigations - Update**

This course is designed to update students on changing legal issues as well as a review of current rules and regulations. This course is intended for those who are employed in positions where they conduct law enforcement background investigations. Topics include changes to fair employment laws, waivers and advisements, disclosure of information, and minimum standards.

Prerequisite: Completion of the POST Certified Background Investigation Course

## **Basic Academy Directors/Coordinator Training**

This course is designed for students currently employed as academy directors and/or coordinators. Topics include academy management, basic training support, budgeting, ethics, professionalism, instructional planning and testing regulations, and management.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST/STC/CPOST Basic Academy

*Cert: POST (Plan IV)*

*34 Hours*

*1.5 Units*

## **Regular Basic Academy (Modular Format)**

The center offers the regular basic law enforcement academy in an extended modular format for students interested in a law enforcement career. The program contains mandated areas of training as outlined by the California Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST). Topics include ethics, community relations, criminal law, evidence, report writing, vehicle operations, use of force, patrol procedures, traffic procedures, preliminary investigations, custody, lifetime fitness, defense techniques, cultural diversity/discrimination, and selected academy specific areas of training.

The modular extended format is offered on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday evenings from 5:30 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. and on Saturdays from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The course is presented once a year and is approximately eleven (11) months in duration. Cost of the academy includes enrollment fees, student workbooks, training manuals, physical training gear, etc. Course cost is available from the Academy Commander.

Entry-level selection process includes:

- Be at least 18 years of age
- Possess a high school diploma or a General Education Development (GED) test indicating high school graduation or High School Proficiency examination or attainment of a two-year or four-year degree from an accredited college or university
- Possess a valid, unrestricted California Driver's License
- Obtain a California Department of Justice fingerprint clearance: obtain medical clearance

Students seeking academy positions with city police departments or county sheriff agencies should contact those agency personnel offices for specific minimum hiring requirements and desirable qualifications.

## **Boating Accident Investigation/Reconstruction**

This Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) course for law enforcement officers provides advanced enforcement methods for boating safety officer conducting boating accident investigations.

## **Boating Intoxication Enforcement**

This Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) course for law enforcement officers provides training for law enforcement officers conducting activities directed toward investigations of Boating Under the Influence.

## **Boating - Personal Watercraft/Rescue for Law Enforcement**

This course is designed for marine patrol officers who operate Rescue Water Craft (RWC) (Recreationally referred to as Personal Water Craft), as a means of patrol and/or search and rescue. Topics include safety, "active safe ride," technical handling, rescue applications and vessel familiarity.

Recommendation: Assignment to a marine patrol.

## **Boating Safety & Enforcement (Basic)**

This Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) course for law enforcement officers who are or will be enforcing California boating laws. Subject areas include boating equipment and operation requirements, accident investigation, fire suppression, noise suppression and testing, intoxication enforcement, search and rescue, and boarding methods.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST Basic Academy

### **Campus Law Enforcement**

Campus Law Enforcement is designed to meet the minimum training requirements for school police and reserve officers. Content includes role and responsibility; laws, tactical awareness, campus/community oriented policing, mediation/conflict resolution, incident command systems, and the dynamics of student behavior.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST/STC/CPOST Basic Academy

*Cert: POST (Plan IV)                      32 Hours                      2 Units*

### **Child Abuse Investigation (Non-ICI)**

Child Abuse Investigations (Non-ICI) is a 40-hour course based on revised POST guidelines for child abuse investigation training. This course is designed to cover the legal aspects, types of child abuse, protective custody, investigation procedures, evidence collection, and case preparation. This course meets PC 13517 requirements. This is a NON-ICI presentation, designed to meet the needs of non-POST state agencies that need this training.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST Basic Academy/Completion of a Basic Special Investigations Academy or other specialized training as approved by Dean.

*Cert: POST (Plan IV)                      40 Hours                      2 Units*

### **Code Enforcement Officer Course (Basic)**

The Basic Code Enforcement Officer course is designed for current Code Enforcement Officers or an individual who may desire to seek employment as a Code Enforcement Officer. Topics include elements of code enforcement, zoning codes, vehicle abatement, substandard housing, right of entry and inspection warrants, report writing case preparation, abatement of sub-standard housing, and officer safety.

Prerequisite: None

*Cert: Not Required                      40 Hours                      2 Units*

## **Code Enforcement Officer Course (Intermediate)**

Intermediate Code Enforcement Officer Course is a 40 hour course designed for current Code Enforcement Officers or individuals who may desire to seek employment in this field. Course topics include: tactical communications, the use of pepper spray, legal updates, courtroom testimony, problem policing (POP), customer service and officer safety/animal awareness and related hazards.

Prerequisite: None

*Cert: Not Required                      40 Hours                      1 Units*

## **Code Enforcement Officer Course (Advanced)**

The Advanced Code Enforcement Officer course is designed for current Code Enforcement Officers. The advanced course will discuss legal issues, mechanical codes, electrical codes, plumbing codes, fire codes, drug recognition, vectors, molds, multi-agency task force, and documentation.

Advisory: It is strongly recommended that students taking this course have already successfully completed the Basic Code Enforcement Officer Course.

*Cert: Not Required                      40 Hours                      2 Units*

## **Code Enforcement—Introduction to Supervision**

The Code Enforcement, Introduction to Supervision, course is designed to introduce current Code Enforcement officers or new supervisors to Supervision. Topics include budgeting, community relations, personnel issues and leadership.

Advisory: It is strongly recommended that students taking this course have already successfully completed the Basic Code Enforcement Officer Course.

*Cert: Not Required                      24 Hours                      .5 Units*

## **Community Oriented Policing (COPPS & POPPS)**

COPPS & POPPS is a 24-hour intensive course designed for law enforcement and crime prevention personnel. This course is intended as an introductory level program in the basic concepts of the implementation of Community Oriented Policing and Problem Oriented Policing. Topics include history and philosophy of COPPS and POPPS, S.A.R.A. model and evaluations of POPPS, multi-cultural issues; resource development & community mobilization, facilitation and application of skills, and the supervisor's role.

## **Computer Internet Investigation**

Computer Internet Investigation is an 8-hour, hands-on workshop designed to introduce officers to Internet Crime Investigations. The student will demonstrate and have practical exercises on the scope of the problem, components of the Internet, and how to investigate Internet crime.

## **Crime Analysis Process**

Crime Analysis Process is designed to meet the needs of relatively new crime analysts and supervisors responsible for crime analysis functions. The course curriculum has been prepared in cooperation with subject experts and the Office of Criminal Justice Planning.

## **Crime Prevention (Basic)**

Students representing law enforcement agencies are requested to bring 30 copies of their agency's pamphlets, brochures, advertising and educational materials utilized for public information. These examples will be shared with other attendees.

Individuals attending are required to bring a ½" bland VHS tape for self assessment. Students are requested to bring a laptop computer pre-loaded with "PowerPoint and a blank "disc."

Additional topics: the proper selection of cameras, lenses, tripods, films, filters, specialized lighting techniques and high energy forensic lights.

## **Crime Scene Investigation/Evidence Recovery**

*Presented by FBI*

Crime Scene Investigation/Evidence Recovery is conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The primary focus of this course is on becoming an effective team leader, including the application of team development skills.

## **Driving Under the Influence—Update**

This course is designed to update the law enforcement officer on DUI enforcement techniques, current and case law, and some drug influence information. ## **Drug and Alcohol Recognition (DAR)**

## **Drug Recognition Evaluator (DRE)**

Drug Recognition Evaluator (DRE) is an extensive, advanced officer drug impairment training course leading to State Certification through the highway patrol and International Association of Chief of Police (IACP) Credentialing. The DRE is an effective means of identifying and prosecuting drug impaired individuals and has become the accepted standard throughout the United States primarily due the accuracy and effectiveness of the evaluator.

Prerequisite: Previous training in National Highway Traffic Safety Administration Standardized Field Sobriety Testing.

## **Evidence & Property Room Management**

This course is designed to provide basic instruction regarding the management or re-design of a law enforcement property/evidence storage system. Topics include Role and responsibility, property management domains, disposal issues, hazardous materials, client service and employee safety.

## **Field Training Officer (FTO)**

This course is designed for officers who are assigned the responsibility of training recruit officers. ## **Field Training Program – Administrator’s Course**

## **Fingerprint Classification & Identification (Basic)**

Basic Fingerprint Classification & Identification provides basic instruction in the Henry classification system and practical application in identifying patterns and comparing ink print to ink print. This course is required for those students wishing to take a Latent Print Course in the future.

## **Latent Fingerprint Identification and Comparison Advanced**

Latent Fingerprint Identification and Comparison (Advanced) is a 32 hour course designed to introduce advanced methods of latent Fingerprint Identification and Comparison, ACE-V scientific method, NCIC Classification and AFIS formulas. Provides essential knowledge necessary to present expert fingerprint courtroom testimony.

Prerequisites: Must have successfully completed the 40-hour Basic Fingerprint Identification & Classification course, or the 40-hour FBI Basic Fingerprint Classification Course, or an equivalent course recognized by the Dean of the Sacramento Regional Public Safety Training Center.

### ***Firearms Instructor***

Firearms Instructor is designed to train individuals to be firearm instructors. The course covers liability issues, lesson plan development, firearms course preparation, wound ballistics, basic marksmanship principles, target analysis, assessing shooting problems, static line drills, handgun and movement courses, patrol shotgun and movement courses, carbine familiarization, partner communication techniques, handgun/long gun transitions, non-traditional shooting positions, and plainclothes officer and off duty training.

Advisory: Each student will be required to ❶ demonstrate handgun proficiency by firing a minimum score of 80% on a modified 40 round Tactical Firearms course (TRC), and ❷ demonstrate acceptable firearms safety techniques before completing the course. Unsuccessful candidates will not receive certification.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST/STC/CPOST Basic Academy or equivalent as determined by Dean.

### ***Firearms Instructor - Update***

Firearms Instructor Update is a 24-hour course designed to update experienced firearms instructors who have previously completed the Basic Firearms Instructor course. Topics include legal updates, liability issues, police officer shooting statistics, police officer shooting concerns, course lesson plan development, multiple officers shooting positions, close quarter combat drills, target analysis and shooter problems, and student courses of fire.

*demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of a Firearms instructor Course

## **Firearms/Rifle Instructor – Update**

Firearms/Rifle Instructor Course Update is a 24-hour course designed to instruct others in the use of the patrol carbine in general patrol use, close quarters combat and active shooter response. Emphasis will be on the use of the weapon by the patrol officer/deputy/state trooper in a combat environment. This course meets the requirements set forth in 12020(b)1 of the California Penal Code in regards to the use of short barreled rifles as set forth by the POST Commission.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST certified firearms instructor course or equivalent as determined by Dean.

## **Firearms Instructor Update—Advanced Firearms Instructional Techniques (AFIT)**

*Presented by FBI*

Firearms Instructor Update Advanced Firearms Instructional Techniques (AFIT) is designed to provide the law enforcement firearms instructor with additional skills in order to more effectively deal with “problem shooters.” Topics include shooting fundamentals, in particular trigger control techniques, shooter assessment, and the presentation of a variety of shooter assessment and remedial firearms drills.

Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST Basic Firearms Course

Cert: *POST (Plan IV)*      *16 Hours*      *.25 Unit*

## **Force and Weaponry (Basic)**

Basic Force and Weaponry is designed to train probation officers who are required to carry firearms in the proper escalation/use-of-force and the use of firearms. The course will include day and night shooting techniques from various shooting

positions, officer survival techniques, and officer safety techniques during arrests. Students will be required to demonstrate proficiency in the agency weapon of choice during target and combat qualification exercises and arrest control techniques. Students should attend classes wearing casual clothing and rubber soled, non-marking shoes. The first 24 hours meets PC 832 firearms requirement.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST/STC/CPOST Academy and/or completion of the PC 832 Arrest, Search and Seizure Course.

### **Force and Weaponry - Update**

Force and Weaponry Update is designed to train probation officers who are required to carry firearms in the proper escalation/use of force and the use of firearms. Students will be required to demonstrate proficiency in the agency weapon of choice during target and combat qualification exercises and arrest control techniques. Students should attend classes wearing casual clothing and rubber soled non-marking shoes.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of a POST/STC/CPOST Academy and completion of the PC 832 Arrest, Search and Seizure Course.

### **Impact Weapons Instructor Course**

The Impact Weapons Instructor course is designed to train law enforcement officers to instruct in the use of all conventional police impact weapons, to function as an in-house trainer, and to evaluate various options for his/her agency in the use of impact weapons. The instructor will be certified in the use of the following impact weapons: 26' baton, side handle baton, YWARA, KUBOTAN, SHORT BILLY, LONG BATON, and the HANDLER 12, the O.P.N., and the expandable baton (ASP and Winchester).

Advisory: This is a physically demanding course and participants should be in good physical condition. Participants with prior injuries should be cleared by their agency

physician for intense physical activity. Protective equipment is provided. Those persons unable to fully participate in a physically demanding course will be dismissed from the class.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

## **Impact Weapons Instructor Course – Update**

Impact Weapons Instructor Course Update is designed to update impact weapon instructors in the use of all conventional police impact weapons, to function as an in-house trainer, and to evaluate various options for his/her agency in the use of impact weapons. The instructor should be certified in the use of the following impact weapons: 26' baton, side handle baton, YWARA, KABATON, SHORT BILLY, LONG BATON, and the HANDLER 12, the O.P.N., and the expandable baton (ASP and Winchester).

Advisory: This course is a physically demanding course and participants should be in good physical condition.

*Because this course is designed to provide practical hands-on training in police tactics and weapon usage, participants in this course will engage in physically demanding classroom training exercises that include a risk of injury to the participants.*

Prerequisite: Completion of the Approved 80 hour Impact Weapons Course. Proof of completion will be required.

## **Instructor Development—Basic Course**

Instructor Development – Basic Course is a 40-hour course designed to focus on the basic instructional skills necessary for the law enforcement instructor. Topics include POST Basic Course Instructional System; roles and responsibilities of the instructor, concepts of adult learning, POST instructor workbook series, elements of a training plan, delivery strategies, instructional resources, presentation skills, and basic course evaluation, testing, and remediation.

This course qualifies graduates to teach in a POST Basic Academy and receive the Basic Course Instructor Certificate.

## **Instructor Development** - *Presented by FBI*

Instructor Development is a 40-hour course focusing on the basic instructional skills necessary for the law enforcement instructor. Areas to be covered include principles of the adult learner, instructor delivery skills, training needs assessment, instructional goals and objectives, overcoming stage fright, and methods of instruction. The class includes several practical exercises in classroom presentation and the preparation of lesson plans. This course is designed for those law enforcement officers who are assigned as instructors or anticipating such an assignment.

## **Internet Crimes Against Children**

Internet crimes Against Children is a 16-hour course designed to provide law enforcement officers the information and skills necessary to recognize and properly respond to criminality involving the use of computers and the Internet to exploit children for the purpose of sexual gratification. The course is designed for officers newly assigned to handle the investigation of the computer exploitation of children.

Topics will include types of offenders, sources used to exploit children, the current applicable statutes and requirements.

Prerequisite: Successful completion of a Basic Law Enforcement Academy or equivalent as determined by Dean.

## **Interview and Interrogation Techniques**

Interview and Interrogation Techniques is designed for law enforcement personnel in the behavioral analysis approach to interrogation. Topics include psychology of deception, vocal gestures as indicators, body language as indicators, psychology of confessions, Miranda warning review, and emotional behavior symptoms.

## **Introduction to Seizure and Examination of Computers**

The course also provides training in managing the media, on scene incident management and the media, issue identification and management, crisis management, preparing your superiors for the media, and how to communicate with the media using press releases, alerts, incident briefings, fact sheets, and interviews.

The students will also receive instruction regarding ballistics, observer/sniper equipment, and the maintenance and care of equipment. The class is available to supervisors and officers assigned the responsibility of observer/sniper functions in police crisis situations. This course is appropriate for law enforcement SWAT team members assigned as observers/snipers or anticipating such assignment.

## **Traffic Collision Investigation (Basic)**

Topics include vehicle code law, as well as related codes relating to operation of a motor vehicle involved in a traffic accident; techniques for determining driver being under the influence of alcohol or drugs, and introductory methods of determining vehicle speed from skid marks.

## **Traffic Collision Investigation (Intermediate)**

Students will also learn how to conduct a basic vehicle damage assessment. The course will use extensive practical application and field exercise, which will require some after hours class work.

## **Traffic Collision Investigation (Advanced)**

This course will include advanced diagramming techniques for preparing scale diagrams, methods of determining coefficient of friction and speed from tire friction marks, resultant drag factors, vehicle dynamics, how to conduct a basic post collision vehicle mechanical inspection, how to

measure and draw scale vehicle damage silhouettes, human factors and restraint usage and Vehicle Code Law. This course uses practical application and field exercises which will require some after hours class work.

## **Traffic Collision Reconstruction**

### **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

Fire technology is the science of fighting and preventing fires through an organized team effort. Firefighters must have a thorough understanding of the physical and chemical laws of combustion, a working knowledge of firefighting and safety equipment, and ability to administer emergency medical aid. The fundamental principles and underlying causes for destructive fires are coupled with basic fire prevention techniques, fire behavior and control, and fire hydraulics as a background for advanced training. This includes a study of fire chemistry and physics, firefighting equipment and extinguishing agents, solution to fire hazards, and an introduction to the organization of various firefighting units. Advanced training includes fire safety and safety equipment, sprinkler and alarm systems, portable fire extinguishing equipment.

### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

The Fire Technology curriculum at American River College is designed as professional training for individuals interested in, and qualified for, a career in the fire service. The program offers practical and technical instruction to meet the ever-increasing demands and continuous upgrading by fire service agencies. ## **Course Descriptions**

### **FT 110 Fire Apparatus 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course covers fire apparatus design, specifications, and performance capabilities. It also includes the effective utilization of apparatus in fire service emergencies.

### **FT 130 Fire Company Organization and Management 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides a review of fire department organization, planning, organizing, and supervising to meet the needs of the fire department with emphasis on the company officer's role.

### **FT 132 Fire Service Records and Reports 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course covers fire department records systems, principles of report writing, applications in the area of pre-fire survey, and post-fire reporting.

## **FT 140 Related Codes and Ordinances 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course includes familiarization and interpretation of national, state, and local codes, as well as ordinances and laws which influence the field of fire prevention.

## **FT 170 Fire Investigation 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course includes determining the cause of fires (accidental, suspicious and incendiary), types of fires, related laws, introduction to incendiary fires, recognizing and preserving evidence, interviewing witnesses and suspects, arrest, detention, and court procedures.

## **FT 180 Rescue Practices 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course focuses on rescue problems and techniques, emergency rescue equipment, toxic gases, chemicals, diseases, and radiation hazards. Also included are the care of victims including emergency childbirth, respiration and resuscitation, extrication and other emergency conditions.

## **FT 190 Fire Tactics and Strategy 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course includes principles of fire control through the utilization of manpower, equipment, and extinguishing agents on the fireground.

## **FT 192 Wildland Fire Control 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090.*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course covers all aspects of wildland fire fighting and introduces new advances in technology for wildland fire suppression.

### **FT 300 Fire Protection Organization 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides an introduction to fire protection, career opportunities in fire protection and related fields, philosophy and history of fire protection, fire loss analysis, organization and function of public and private fire protection services, fire departments as part of local government, laws and regulations affecting the fire service, fire service nomenclature, specific fire protection functions, basic fire chemistry and physics, introduction to fire protection systems, introduction to fire strategy and tactics.

### **FT 301 Fire Prevention Technology 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Co-requisite: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides fundamental information regarding the history and philosophy of fire prevention, organization and operation of a fire prevention bureau, use of fire codes, identification and correction of fire hazards, and the relationship of fire prevention with fire safety education and detection and suppression system.

### **FT 302 Fire Protection Equipment and Systems 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Co-requisite: FT 300 or FIRE 1090.*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides information relating to the features of design and operation of fire detection and alarm systems, heat and smoke control systems, special protection and sprinkler systems, water supply for fire protection, and portable fire extinguishers.

### **FT 303 Building Construction for Fire Protection 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Co-requisite: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course is the study of the components of building construction that relate to fire safety. The elements of construction and design of structures are shown to be key factors when inspecting buildings, pre-planning fire operations and operating at fires. The development and evolution of building and fire codes will be studied in relationship to past fires in residential, commercial and industrial occupancies.

### **FT 304 Fire Behavior and Combustion 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Co-requisite: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides the student with the theories and fundamentals of and why fires start, spread, and are controlled, an in-depth study of fire chemistry and physics, fire characteristics of materials, extinguishing agents, and fire control techniques.

### **FT 310 Fire Service Hydraulics 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course provides information on obtaining water from various sources of supply, properly routing it through the pump, and discharging it through various devices with the proper pressures for fire suppression.

### **FT 320 Hazardous Materials 3 Units**

*Prerequisite: None*

*Advisory: FT 300 or FIRE 1090*

*Course Transferable to CSU*

*Hours: 54 hours Lecture*

This course is an introduction to the world of hazardous chemicals, including physical properties, uses in industry, and characteristics when involved in spills, fires, and accidents. This course also provides basic hazardous materials information regarding emergency procedures, legal requirements, and compliance to regulations.

# **California State Fire Training Certification**

The following courses are held at the Sacramento Regional Public Safety Training Center (SRPSTC) located at 5146 Arnold Avenue, McClellan (formerly McClellan AFB). These courses are certified by the California State Fire Marshal's Office. All courses are offered in an intense, concentrated format. Course registration is accomplished by contacting the SRPSTC by phone (916) 570-5000 or in person. Student registration into some courses may be restricted by California statute of prerequisites. Pre-payment is required for course registration.

## **Fire Command 1A**

Fire Command 1A is designed to introduce the in-service student to the problems of commanding a fire or other hazardous incidents. It satisfies entry requirements to the Command Academy at Asilomar. The content is geared for the "First In" officer at emergency scenes. Topics emphasize the management and decision making skills required for command.

Prerequisite: None

## **Fire Command 1B**

Fire Command 1B is designed to take the student into the critical emergencies of handling hazardous materials. Instruction covers the inherent problems of commanding the scene and safely controlling and disposing of the materials. This course completes the required prerequisite to the Command Academy at Asilomar.

Prerequisite: Fire Command 1A

## **Fire Command 1C**

Fire Command 1C is a 40 hour course designed to address the various aspects of I-Zone firefighting. Emphasis is on the management and decision making process required for successful command in the urban-interface environment.

Prerequisite: Fire Command 1A & I-200

## **Fire Command 2A (Command Tactics and Major Fires)**

Fire Command 2A is a 40-hour course that prepares the fire officer to use management techniques and the Incident Command System when commanding multiple alarms or large suppression forces.

Prerequisite: Fire Command 1A

## **Fire Instructor 1A (Instructional Techniques)**

Fire Instructor 1A is designed to provide the following instructional techniques: the occupational analysis, course outline, concepts of learning, levels of instruction, behavioral objectives, lesson plan development, psychology of learning, and instructor evaluation. Student teaching demonstrations are required. This course applies to California Fire Service Training and Education System Certification.

## **Fire Instructor 1B (Instructional Techniques)**

Fire Instructor 1B is a 40-hour continuation of Fire Technology 86A. Topics include developing instructional aids, fundamentals of testing, and evaluation techniques and instruments. Student teaching demonstrations are required. This course applies to California Fire Service Training and Education System's Certification.

Prerequisite: Fire Instructor 1A

## **Fire Investigation 1A (Fire Cause and Origin Determination)**

Fire Investigation 1A is designed to provide the fire fighter with the skills and knowledge required to investigate and report on the source of fire emergencies. Legal and jurisdictional issues are covered, along with the evidence collection procedures and documentation required.

Prerequisite: None

*Cert: POST/ CFSTES                      40 Hours                      2 Units*

## **Fire Investigation 1B (Techniques of Fire Investigation)**

Fire Investigation 1B is designed to build the necessary skills to determine the cause of fire, its human and environmental effects, and to develop interpersonal skills needed to successfully investigate, apprehend, and convict the arsonist. Topics include criminal law, search and seizure, evidence collection and laboratory services, fire death investigation, fire behavior and effects, interview and

interrogation techniques, general insurance procedures and construction costs, and surveillance; court demeanor; and fire causes.

Prerequisite: Fire Investigation 1A

*Cert: POST/CFSTES                      40 Hours                      2 Units*

### **Fire Investigation 2A (Criminal and Legal Procedures)**

Fire Investigation 2A is designed to provide the information to successfully investigate, apprehend, and convict arsonists and focuses heavily on the legal case preparation. Topics include interviewing/interrogating suspects, search/seizure, warrants, courtroom demeanor, and working with your district attorney's office. This course will prepare the participants for the courtroom.

Prerequisite: Fire Investigation 1A & 1B

### **Fire Investigation 2B**

This course provides advanced instruction in fire scene investigation, case preparation and courtroom presentation. Topics include reviewing fire scene photography, sketching, evidence collection, interviewing and interrogation.

Prerequisite: Fire Investigation 1A, Fire Investigation 1B and, Fire Investigation 2A.

### **Fire Management 1 (Management/Supervision for Company Officers)**

Fire Management 1 is designed to prepare and/or enhance the first time supervisor's ability to supervise subordinates. It introduces key management concepts and practices utilized in the California Fire Service. The course includes discussions about decision making, time management, leadership styles, personnel evaluations, and counseling guidelines.
